### MINUTES

October 15, 2025

#### I. CALL TO ORDER

#### III. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

*Vice Chair Davenport moved to approve the meeting Agenda for the Rock Road MSTU Advisory Committee. Second by Ms. Boger. Carried unanimously 3 - 0.*

#### **IV. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

*Vice Chair Davenport moved to approve the minutes of the April 9, 2025, Rock Road Advisory Committee meeting as presented. Second by Ms. Boger. Carried unanimously 3 – 0.*

#### **V. PROJECT MANAGER REPORT – Judy Sizensky**

##### **A. Discussion of Maintenance**

**Ms. Sizensky** reported:

- Prior roadway repairs on two sections of road, Keri Island Road (Section from Rock Road to Catawba St.) and Rock Road (Section from Mingo Drive to Keri Island Road), were insufficient.
- Request for Quotes (RFQ) to grade, compact, prep and place limerock on sections of Keri Island Road were solicited from Coastal Construction, Quality Enterprises USA (QE), and Preferred Materials, Inc. (PMI). PMI was the sole responder.
- Preferred Materials, Inc. (PMI), Collier County's contractor for *Asphalt Maintenance and Related Services*, submitted Estimate # CC21860-043, dated October 14, 2025, in the amount of \$71,437.00 to fine grade, compact, prep and place limerock on multiple areas of Keri Island Road.
- PMI recommended exploration of surface beneath potholes to determine cause of initial road repair failure.
- Fiscal Year 2026 funds to finance PMI's proposal are insufficient. Alternative solutions will be considered.
- A request will be submitted to the Road Maintenance Division to undertake the road repair/maintenance project at the expense of the MSTU.

**Committee** discussion:

- Areas of roadways were prioritized for maintenance.
- Feasibility of paving should be considered.
- Landscape contractors' vehicles produce excessive wear and tear on the roads.
- An evaluation of maintenance endurance will be reviewed at the next meeting.

**Ms. Sizensky** noted:

- Paving of roadways requires an amendment to Collier County Ordinance No. 2024-03, filed with the Clerk of The Board of County Commissioners and the Florida Secretary of State.
- Property easements will be researched to determine Right of Way (ROW) limits.
- Grant money awarded to the County is not available for maintenance of private roads.
- Ms. Boger will be invited to participate in meetings with contractors.

*Ms. Boger motioned to approve the purchase and delivery of material to fill large pot holes with two and a half to three inch rock, topped with limerock, on Keri Island Road from Catawba Street east across Rock Road into the east side of Keri Island Road, for an amount not to exceed \$20,000.00. Second by Vice Chair Davenport. Carried unanimously 3 – 0.*

##### **B. Budget Report**

**Ms. Sizensky** reported:

Rock Road MSTU FY25 Fund Budget 1632 dated October 15, 2025 – prepared October 6, 2025.

**Ms. Sizensky** provided an overview of the budget highlighting:

- **Purchase Orders**

Fiscal Year 2026 Purchase Orders are pending.

- **Budget**

1. Line 1, Ad Valorem Tax Millage – Millage assessed totals \$25,900, an increase of \$800 over 2024.
2. Line, 8, Carry Forward - Unexpended Prior Year (2025) Funds total \$55,000.
3. Total Revenue – \$79,600, including interest, carry forward amounts, and contributions, minus a 5% (\$1,300) reserve for estimated uncollected revenue.
4. Operating Expense – Of the \$70,800 budgeted, \$1,150 is committed to existing Purchase Orders, leaving the remainder of \$69,650 available within budget for additional operating expenses as needed.
5. Linea 20, 21, and 22, County Overhead - \$8,800 budgeted, \$0 has been transferred (PTNE Staff & Overhead, Property Appraiser, & Tax Collector).
6. All Expenses– Of the \$79,600 budgeted, \$1,150 is committed in existing Purchase Orders, leaving the remainder of \$78,450 available for MSTU expenditures.

- **General**

1. The Fiscal Year 2026 budget is effective October 1, 2025.
2. Unspent fiscal year 2025 funds were carried forward to 2026.
3. The MSTU tax rate for 2026 is 3.0000 per \$1000.00 of taxable value is for maintenance of private roads.
4. The Ad Valorem property tax value increased 3.64% for fiscal year 2025 over 2024 generating additional revenue of \$800.
5. The Office of Budget Management assumes 5% of the millage assessed will be delinquent and factors the assumption into the budget.
6. Tax millage collected by the Rock Road MSTU may only be utilized by the MSTU and within the MSTU district boundary.
7. Uncommitted funds available within budget are eligible for transfer to other categories upon approval by the Committee.

## **VIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

### Emergency Vehicle Access

Road enhancements to enable emergency vehicle access should be considered.

### Deer Run Lane Maintenance

- Deer Run Lane has potholes which should be filled.
- Materials will be ordered and delivered by the MSTU.
- Labor will be performed by the Road Maintenance Division and reimbursed by the MSTU.

***Vice Chair Davenport moved to approve road maintenance repairs on the east side of Deer Run Lane for an amount not to exceed \$3,500.00. Second by Chair Sanchez. Carried unanimously 3 – 0.***

**Shady Lane Road Maintenance**

- The road condition of Shady Lane east of Rock Road is sub-standard with grass separating tire track markings and should be repaired.
- Materials will be ordered and delivered by the MSTU.
- Labor will be performed by the Road Maintenance Division and reimbursed by the MSTU.

***Vice Chair Davenport motioned to approve an amount not to exceed \$2,500.00 to repair Shady Lane east of Rock Road. Second by Chair Sanchez. Motion Carried 2 – 1. Ms. Boger voted “no.”***

**Traffic Signage**

- Signs are in the Asset Management System, but the MSTU is the maintenance custodian.
- STOP and Street signs must be installed at the expense of the MSTU.
- Speed limit signs are the responsibility of the Traffic Operations Division on County maintained roads.
- The Committee requested that the County install four STOP signs on Rock Road.

***Ms. Sizensky will contact the Traffic Operations Division to convey the request and update the Committee on the status at the next meeting.***

**Sidewalks Rock Road**

Citing safety concerns, installation of sidewalks on the County maintained section of Rock Road was suggested.

**Road Grading Frequency**

Cost to grade private roads on a more consistent basis will be researched.

**IX. MEMBER COMMENTS**

**Ms. Sizensky** noted:

- The Road Maintenance Division mowed the County owned paved portion of Rock Road.
- Landscape maintenance on private roads is the responsibility of the individual property owner.
